

Dear Wildcat Families:

This has been a winter for the record books. As you know, we have now used all five of the allotted snow days for the 2025 – 2026 school year. Now that the district has an option to utilize fully remote instruction in place of snow days, we will be required to shift to remote learning days if we use any additional snow days this year.

The district will continue to use the ParentSquare notification system to provide timely communication to parents and staff members regarding delays and cancellations as well as other district emergencies. We will continue to communicate closings on local television stations, including WWNY-TV Channel 7 and WWTI 50. When school is closed and remote learning is put into effect, it will appear on local television stations as “Remote Learning.” When a decision is made to close school, all other after-school activities scheduled are also cancelled.

Please see the attached document titled, “Remote Learning Protocols 2025 - 2026.” This will inform you of the district expectations and requirements when a remote learning day is called due to inclement weather. Again, if we have any additional snow days this year, we will be required to shift to remote learning.

We all know that remote learning is not ideal! It will not look like a normal school day, nor should it. If we are required to shift to remote learning, it will no doubt be challenging but we will work together to make this the best experience possible for our students.
